### Mac & Peg Hulslander's summer at Chautauqua

Two years ago, the UCC Society welcomed Mac as a lay leader to serve as the Chaplain-of-the-Week. This year he and his wife, Peg, are serving as hosts of the UCC Society's Reformed Church House. They have been coming to Chautauqua ever since the late 1960s though this is their first year as hosts. "I've loved the holistic approach to Chautauqua," Peg says, "the combination of recreation, lectures, and art is really wonderful." Likewise, Chautauqua is a special place for Mac who has spent a number of birthdays here with friends he doesn't get to see very often.

The Hulslanders gave the UCC Society and the greater Chautauqua community a chance to fellowship and explore an issue that is very close to their hearts – environmental stewardship. The hosted a showing of ***For the Next 7 Generations: 13 Indigenous Grandmothers Weaving a World that Works***, a documentary that follows indigenous women from across the globe who have come together to ensure the protection of the planet for their grandchildren and future generations. The Hulslanders introduced the film to their book study group at the Dimock Camp Meeting in Dimock, PA, where they have a summer cottage. The group was interested in Native American spirituality and has been using the film as a way to learn more about it. The film brings together the experience and wisdom of various indigenous traditions regarding prayer, hospitality, and care for the earth.
